

CLERK'S REPORT - KAREN KUDEROVITCH

The Parish Council has just finished the financial year 21-22 and are busy preparing for the internal and external audit process. If you are interested in finance, please see our dedicated web page which will be updated in May with the financial information for 21-22 and our intended projects for 22-23.

Due to the fact that I do not live in Highwood and it proving difficult to co-ordinate getting the new newsletter to many addresses, we are going to use a single distributor. A huge thank you to all those residents who kindly gave up their time in the past to distribute the Highwood magazine, your efforts were much appreciated.

We are in the process of discussing Highway improvements from Edney Common to Loves Green and we had an onsite meeting on 22nd April to discuss possibilities & the funding required. We are also considering CCTV/ANPR and the purchase of SIDs (Speed Indicator Devices) to attempt to reduce speed. Once we have figures on all these projects we will consult with residents for their views.

At the March meeting the Parish Council resolved to replace the bus shelter opposite the Highwood Primary School, hopefully when the school is closed to reduce disruption.

We will soon be replacing some notice boards in the Parish and will ensure these are updated on a regular basis.

I really hope to meet residents of Highwood Parish at the Annual Parish Meeting on Wednesday 18th May 2022, doors open at 6.45pm.

FINANCE

Please see below financial information. Highwood Parish Council are currently investigating a number of projects which include footpaths works from Edney Common to Loves Green & the possibility of CCTV/ANPR. Both of these projects could be high expenditure, and we will consult with residents when we have clear costs to share, for residents to share their views.

The Parish Council has agreed the expenditure of £9,383 for a new bus shelter to be installed opposite Highwood Primary School. We will also be spending £223 on Queen's Jubilee bookmarks to present to the school children. We are also looking into the possibility of purchasing a Speed Indicator Device to try and help address speeding issues.

RideLondon road closure information

RideLondon, the world's greatest festival of cycling, returns for its eighth edition, with new routes in Essex, from Friday 27 May to Sunday 29 May 2022. Extensive road closures will be required in some areas on these dates.

This leaflet will help you plan your travel around Essex ahead of the event. Further information about RideLondon, including the road closures in London, is available online at ridelondon.co.uk/road-closures

About RideLondon

Following a two-year absence due to the pandemic, RideLondon 2022 will feature more than 75,000 cyclists and five different events. The festival of cycling is a London 2012 Olympic Games legacy event and was developed by the Mayor of London. Last year, RideLondon entered into a new partnership with Essex County Council that will see the event take place in the county for the first time in 2022.

Events in Essex and London on Sunday 29 May

- RideLondon-Essex 100

Around 25,000 amateur cyclists will take on the 100-mile challenge on closed roads in London and Essex, starting on Victoria Embankment, travelling into Essex through Epping Forest, Uttlesford and Chelmsford, finishing back in the capital at Tower Bridge.


- RideLondon-Essex 60 and 30

The 60 and 30-mile ride options have been created for those wishing to cycle a shorter distance, including newer riders. These rides are held within the existing 100-mile route.

FROM THE VICAR

Rev. Tony Cant

Dear friends,

The terrible events since February 24 have completely changed our lives and we couldn't have had that in a bad dream, we didn't see such horror even in dramatic films about the war. Russia attacked us with bombing cities with heavy air bombs with huge columns of modern tanks and other military equipment, missiles and well-trained soldiers and with a terrible ideology, superiority over the whole world of Putin's crazy ideas of the Russian world and the name of this Russian war. The population of Russia is fooled by Putin's propaganda about that Russia is the only bearer of peace, that all around are enemies who want to destroy Russia, the United States is the main enemy, and Ukraine, which was once part of the USSR and dared to choose the path of democratic development for itself, is striving for the European ideal, that Ukraine should be punished in the most severe way for this. Many years to the Russian people all Russian TV channels said that Nazis ruled in Ukraine, who oppressed ethnic Russians, physically destroyed, mocked, forbidden to speak Russian, and the people 80% believe this snake and believe that the Russian army went to save Ukraine, the Russian population, that the army does not kill anyone, but simply wants to change power and return Ukraine under the protection of Russia.

What's going on in our land, you of course know from the news. They bombed houses, schools, hospitals, objects of life providing, cities water utilities, electrical, networks heat communications, oil depot, gas facilities, captured Chernobyl and Zaporozhye nuclear power plants. And most importantly - people are dying not only the military who protect their homeland their land their families, thousands of civilians died or were injured and lost their homes, property and were forced to leave their homeland, there are already many of them. During the bombing of peaceful forces, our employee Natasha Derkach died - beautiful cheerful very kind she was animal volunteer and because of the homeless nine dogs she fed in the village, she didn't stay in the city in relative safety. But can it be considered safe to stay in the Center unsuitable for shelter from bombing in the basement of the dormitory building of the Center? Of course not, this can protect against fragments from a bomb explosion in the distance or from small arms weapons, but not from a direct hit by a bomb in the building, but we pray to God that this does not happen. 30 employees of the center, including Dr. P and me and 30 children with psychoneurological disorders and mothers since February 24, are living completely at the center periodically during air alarms descend into the basement. From the maternity hospital, seven newborn babies with four mothers came to us: one triplets, one twins, and two children, six girls and one boy. Mothers cannot reach their families and while there is a danger of suffering from shelling on their way home. Besides children, we sheltered sick lonely old people. This is how we fulfill our duty and mission to care and protect those who require it and of course your money now we are spending for the purposes of life providing: the food for everyone at the center and security.

We are very grateful to you, your family and everyone who always help the Revival Center.

A lot can happen in a month, and the war in Ukraine has dominated our news. I have friends in Ukraine from when I used to take students and staff from Anglia Ruskin University on volunteering trips to work in a rehabilitation centre for children suffering from the ongoing effects of the Chernobyl disaster, and with other life-limiting disabilities. Part of a letter from Dr Natalia Zhenchenko, and her husband, Dr Vasily Pasechnik, who run the Centre is printed below.

As a group of churches, (Writtle with Highwood, and Roxwell), we've been collecting humanitarian aid and raising money to send to refugees through UK-Aid, and we're aiming at coordinating peoples' generosity and kindness through a working group connected in with other experienced and well-established agencies as our area eventually welcomes in refugees. Please pray, please give, please do what you can as we play in our part in supporting people who have had their lives turned upside down.

Local Resident Kaye Wadey explains how she has raised money for the people of Ukraine

Sometimes a happy accident has a bigger effect than anyone can foresee! The WI put out a pattern for a corgi to celebrate the Platinum Jubilee and I thought I'd have a practice to see how it looked.

I used some wool left from another project and was quite pleased with the result. It was remarked that the colours were Ukrainian, and as Lesley and Paul Bridgman's son, Tim, is working with the refugees in Poland, where he lives, I thought I would knit up the rest of the wool to send the children there.

When the wool ran out there were 10 puppies and I thought if people would sponsor them to go to Poland the money could go to Tim.

Since the war started the Bridgman's have been sending any contributions people give them to buy food for the refugees. They had been sending £200 a week so I set out to get a week's grocery money.

Thanks to people's generosity we sent £210 and here is the proof it all went to food.

Grants of up to £10,000 are available for insulation, heating and lighting, sustainable energy systems, and more. If your income is under £20,000 after mortgage/rent payments and council tax, you might be eligible.
